As part of this work, they have worked under contract with orthopedic companies, providing consulting services on new products and input on research and development. In addition, some of our physicians have given instructional lectures on implants and surgical techniques for other doctors and medical personnel. In return for their time and expertise, they have been paid a fee for these services.

Rest assured that the choice of implant used for your surgery is made only with your interests and outcome in mind.
